



2012 CIPPIC GOOGLE POLICY FELLOWSHIP

The Google Policy Fellowship aims to offer law students interested in internet and technology policy the opportunity to spend the summer contributing to the public dialogue on these issues and exploring future academic and professional interests. Policy Fellows are placed at various organizations across Canada and the U.S. over the course of the summer.

The Samuelson-Glushko Canadian Internet Policy and Public Interest Clinic (CIPPIC) is pleased to announce that it will again host a Google Policy Fellow in the summer of 2012. At CIPPIC, the Google Policy Fellow will have an opportunity to work with public interest advocates on cutting edge research and public interest advocacy involving issues arising from the intersection of law and technology.

Eligibility: The program is open to graduate and undergraduate Canadian law students and will run from May to July, 2012 (10 weeks). It includes a stipend of US\$7500 to cover accommodation, travel and living costs.

To Apply: Applications are collected by Google through an online submission form and are due **February 3, 2012**. Applicants are asked to indicate their top two preferred organizations. Interviews will take place in late February and early March. Successful applicants will be notified by Monday, March 5, 2012.
